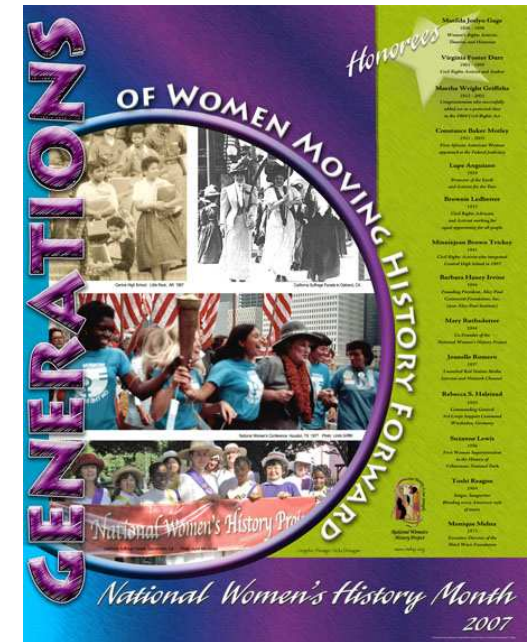

2007 Honorees

Lupe Anguiano (b. 1929)

Protector of the Earth and Activist for the Poor
Lupe Anguiano defies any single category of cause or action. She is a passionate environmental volunteer, helping to protect "Mother Earth" from global warming and other destructive environmental hazards.

Virginia Foster Durr (1903-1999)

Civil Rights Activist and Author
Virginia Foster Durr's long life bridged the post-Civil War era to the American Civil Rights Movement. The granddaughter of a former slave holder, she became an ostracized anti-racist convert.

Matilda Joslyn Gage (1826—1898)

Women's Rights Activist, Theorist, and Historian
Matilda Joslyn Gage was a 19th century suffragist, historian of women, newspaper editor, author and lecturer, woman's rights activist and theorist, advocate for civil rights, and abolitionist.

Martha Wright Griffiths (1912—2003)

Congresswoman
Martha Griffiths' served for 18 years in the United States House of Representatives, she was a tireless and effective advocate for the rights of women .

Rebecca S. Halstead (b.1959)

Commanding General, 3rd Corps Support Command, Wiesbaden, Germany
Brigadier General Rebecca S. Halstead became the first female from the United States Military Academy to be promoted to General Officer rank.

Barbara Haney Irvine (b.1944)

Founding President, Alice Paul Centennial Foundation, Inc.
Barbara Irvine is a national advocate for the recognition and preservation of women's historic sites.

Brownie Ledbetter (b. 1932)

Civil Rights Advocate and Activist
Brownie Ledbetter's life has been dedicated to making the world a better place. Her impact on a fair education for all is indelible.

Suzanne Lewis (b.1956)

First Woman Superintendent of Yellowstone National Park
Suzanne Lewis, became the first female Superintendent of Yellowstone National Park on February 10, 2002.

Monique Mehta (b. 1973)

Executive Director of the Third Wave Foundation
Monique Mehta has worked effectively as a grassroots organizer to help women and with their families with a range of problems facing poor people and immigrants.

Constance Baker Motley (1921 -2005)

First African American Woman Appointed to the Federal Judiciary
Constance Baker Motley's pioneering career as a civil rights lawyer, lawmaker and judge spanned six decades and was highlighted by numerous historic achievements poor people and immigrants.

Toshi Reagon (b. 1964)

Singer, Songwriter, Blending Every American Style of Music
Reagon fits comfortably on a stage at Carnegie Hall, or in a dirty rock club.

Co-Founder, National Women's History Project.
Mary Ruthsdotter co-founded the National Women's History Project in 1980 to ensure that the achievements of women would be recognized in our schools and other institutions.

Minniejean Brown Trickey (b.1941)

Civil Rights Activist
Minniejean Brown Trickey was only sixteen years old when she she along with eight other Black American teenagers, defied death threats, hostile white demonstrators, and even the Arkansas National Guard, to attend the all-white Little Rock Central High in 1957.
